## GAZA UPDATE:

### PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

Since 2018, MedGlobal has been on the ground in Gaza, saving lives. And during the recent escalation in conflict, MedGlobal has further increased its impact.

Since October 7th, 2023, the crisis in Gaza has left 2.1 million people struggling to survive, with 1.9 million internally displaced, facing famine, and enduring unimaginable suffering.

Before October 2023, MedGlobal was already sending medications, medical supplies, and equipment to **three health facilities** benefiting **60,000 men, women and children**.

After October 2023, MedGlobal was one of a few organizations on the ground, serving as a beacon of hope.

We distributed over a **million dollars in medical supplies, equipment and medications** through local procurement. Each surgical kit, pain relief medication, and dialysis supply has been a lifeline to someone in desperate need.

MedGlobal delivered **23,500 liters of fuel** to Shifa and Indonesian hospitals, keeping the heartbeat of these facilities alive. We also provided **3,500 hot meals** for healthcare workers and **2,000 food baskets** for families.

MedGlobal also distributed dignified family hygiene kits to **3000 civilians – 500 families** – staying in schools, camps and the Catholic church in northern Gaza. And our team in Egypt purchased, packed and sent **\$20,000 worth of medical supplies** to the border, ready to go into Gaza.

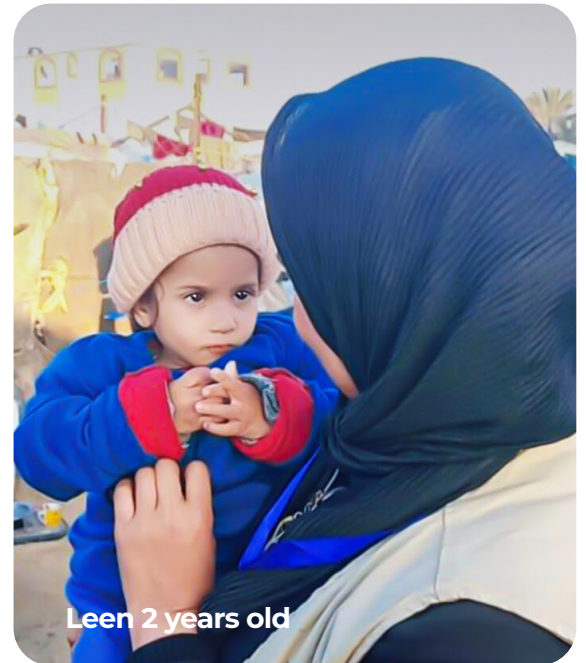
# GAZA CASE REPORT

## LEEN'S JOURNEY: FROM MALNUTRITION TO RECOVERY

In Gaza, conflict has severely impacted nutrition, especially among children. In the Alkawashi camp in Rafah, a 2-year-old girl named Leen was battling severe malnutrition, weighing just 10kg. Her fragile health robbed her of a normal childhood, and her future looked fragile.

But thanks to MedGlobal's intervention, Leen's story changed dramatically. Our team identified her critical condition and referred her to our primary health care for immediate treatment. With comprehensive care, including ready-to-use therapeutic food and essential nutrients, Leen began to recover.

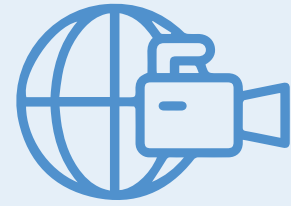
Her health improved significantly, bringing hope and relief to her mother. Leen's journey from despair to recovery highlights the impact of collective humanitarian efforts.

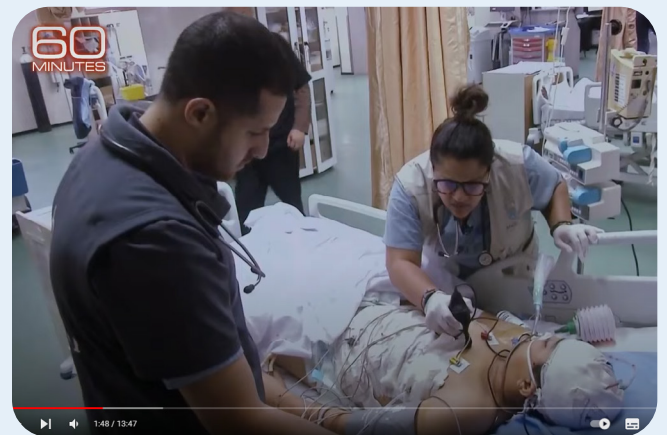

# LEBANON



## LEBANON UPDATE

### PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

Lebanon is a country enduring a heartbreaking crisis. With an economy in freefall and governance struggling, Lebanese families, along with Syrian and Palestinian refugees, face severe hardships. The cost of life's essentials has soared beyond reach, leaving over half of the nation's 5.8 million people in urgent need of food and basic care, and more than 1.2 million seeking access to clean water and safe living conditions. The elderly are particularly vulnerable, as the lack of strong social support networks and retirement plans has created massive gaps in health coverage.

MedGlobal improved access to comprehensive primary healthcare in Bekka, providing healthcare packages – including consultations, laboratory, X-rays, and medications – to **38,691 vulnerable Syrian refugees** and host communities.

We also provided an emergency response to cholera, enhancing disease prevention and helping control the spread of infectious diseases among populations in high risk areas in Lebanon. We spread information about cholera through awareness sessions and support community groups, and provided medical consultations and laboratory testing and treatment to **18,925 direct beneficiaries.**

Finally, our mobile mental health unit – the first project of its kind in Lebanon – brought mental health consultations, medications, therapy, and awareness sessions to **9 cadesters** and **38 facilities** in Lebanon, with **1,970 direct beneficiaries.**

### Bringing Help Home

MedGlobal also offered support to those who needed help in the home. In Beirut, we provided an at-home health program for the elderly, including health services and medication. And in Aarsal, we began a successful thermal wool insulation pilot program, providing biofriendly wool insulation for Syrian refugee tents.



# LEBANON CASE REPORT



## HELPING FAWZIAH BREATHE

Because more than half the people of Lebanon don't have access to basic medical care, getting treatment for short-term and long-term medical concerns can be next to impossible.

When 65-year-old Fawziah walked into the Ghiras Al-Khair Medical Center emergency room, she was grappling with symptoms of acute bronchitis, as well as chronic diabetes and high blood pressure. There, she was met with immediate and thorough care.

Thanks to the support of MedGlobal, the medical team was equipped to provide her with the specialized attention her complex health situation demanded.

Her treatment plan was multifaceted, addressing her acute bronchitis while carefully managing her diabetes and high blood pressure. It was a delicate balance, underlining the critical role of well-equipped emergency facilities in managing complex health cases. MedGlobal's support made it possible for the hospital to provide the multifaceted care Fawziah needed.

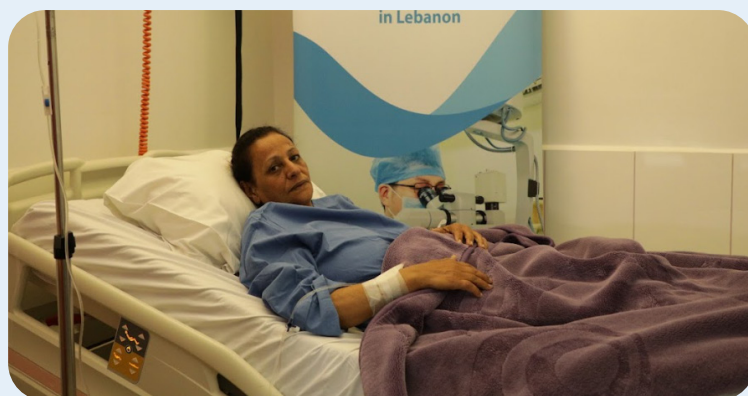

# SYRIA



## SYRIA UPDATE:

### PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

Syria is a complex humanitarian crisis and protection emergency due to more than a decade of ongoing hostilities, with over 4.1 million individuals dependent on humanitarian aid for survival. In February of 2023, catastrophic 7.8 magnitude earthquakes shook the Türkiye-Syria border, pushing Syria to its most critical phase since the onset of the conflict, with unprecedented loss of life and vital infrastructure, including healthcare facilities. MedGlobal, on the ground in Syria since 2017, was ready to meet the rising challenges.

MedGlobal provides sustained support for **five PHC Centers**, delivering an essential primary care package encompassing vital services such as mental health, nutrition awareness, and malnutrition management. The launch of mobile clinics extends our reach, bringing healthcare services to those in hard-to-reach areas, ensuring no one is left behind.

MedGlobal fully or partially supports **16 hospitals**, with a primary focus on providing intensive care services, orthopedic and trauma surgeries, especially after the earthquake. Additionally, our continuous residency capacity-building program is training doctors and health workers, enabling them to specialize in various medical disciplines, particularly in the Idlib region.

We've also distributed **20 portable ultrasound devices**, along with training for medical staff and mental health workshops for **240 healthcare workers**, significantly bolstering healthcare services.

And, we donate fuel, which keeps the lights on and the doors open at hospitals, ensuring continuous care for those in need.

# SYRIA CASE REPORT

## GIVING FARID A HAND

“My son couldn’t hold a cup of water; his fingers have limited movement since he suffered a burn several years ago,” said Farid’s father. “Thank God, thanks to MedGlobal and their surgeon coming from America, they helped us perform a surgery on his hands that is not available in northern Syria. Our joy today is indescribable because he has regained movement in his hands.”

In collaboration with the surgical team from the United States and the UK through the MedGlobal organization, local surgeons operated on Farid to release the adhesions on his hands using skin grafts. After several hours the surgery ended successfully, with Farid’s hand experiencing good blood flow, and Farid able to effectively control the fingers of his injured hand.

The visiting medical team is just one of MedGlobal’s many medical missions to countries like Syria, where access to advanced medical care is limited.

# UKRAINE



## UKRAINE UPDATE:

### PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

Since February 2022, millions of Ukrainians have been forced from their homes and need humanitarian assistance, including food, water, shelter, medical care and heating.

MedGlobal is a critical international partner of Ukraine's healthcare system, which helps to keep the Ukrainian medical front stable during wartime. We distributed medical equipment, medical goods, and medicines throughout **20 regions** in Ukraine, with an emphasis on the frontline territories.

MedGlobal also trained **1472 medical workers** from **10 regions** of Ukraine and **27 medical institutions**. These projects were designed to address critical gaps in medical education and trauma care, support mental health, and provide essential medical resources in collaboration with local authorities and organizations.

MedGlobal initiated mobile clinics in the de-occupied territories of the Kharkiv and Donetsk regions. These clinics are facilities on the move, designed to provide primary medical care, medicines, and referrals in far-flung areas. Implemented during the war, the mobile clinic teams conduct consultations, exams and telemedicine, dispense medications, and provide transportation to hospitals. Most of the patients were women and men aged 60+, due to chronic diseases that worsened during the war.

## Clean Water in Crisis

After the explosion of the dam of the Kakhovka power plant, the Kherson region was on the verge of a humanitarian catastrophe. MedGlobal implemented a large-scale installation and maintenance of a water filtration station in one of the critical medical institutions in Kherson.



# UKRAINE CASE REPORT

## SAVING TIME, SAVING LIVES

70-year-old Oleksandr was on a ventilator when military paramedics delivered him to the Mechnikov hospital in Dnipro. Struggling to hide from missile attacks in the basement of his home, Oleksandr spent a week in severe cold and damp conditions in his basement without food, which had unfortunately resulted in double pneumonia.

"When we received Oleksandr, he was relatively stable, but in five hours his condition worsened as he became breathless," said Valentina Lisnycha, Head of Anesthesiology, Intensive Care, Sepsis Department. "Following protocol, we took an X-ray, but we were worried about how long the image would take to develop. So we opted to use the Butterfly ultrasound device for additional examination."

In minutes the doctors were able to diagnose pneumothorax, a life-threatening condition that requires an immediate response. Thanks to the Butterfly they were able to stabilize Oleksandr, and soon afterwards, Oleksandr recovered and left the hospital.

His story is just one example of how MedGlobal's equipment and short-term medical interventions are saving lives in Ukraine.

# SUDAN



## SUDAN UPDATE:

### PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

In the first quarter of 2023, while humanitarian actors were striving to meet the huge needs gap, a catastrophic conflict erupted in Sudan, which by the end of the year expanded to most of the country. The majority of hospitals ceased operation, tens of humanitarian workers and doctors have been killed, the national stock of medical supplies were destroyed and the healthcare system collapsed. Sudan is now facing the largest internal displacement crisis in the world and the biggest health crisis in decades.

MedGlobal fully supported **seven health facilities** and more than **200 doctors and healthcare workers** serving on the front line in 2023. We also strengthened the national healthcare system by supplying the Northern State with **two shipments of medical aid** at a time when the supply chain was significantly disrupted by conflict.

In Al Fao, MedGlobal constructed and equipped **a new clinic**, conducted a vector control campaign covering **60,000 people** and supplied Al Fao Hospital with medical equipment and medicines, positively impacting the lives of approximately **50,000 people**.

In the middle of the conflict zone, we provided crucial support to operate Al Nada Maternity and Pediatric Hospital, providing free cesarean and normal delivery to more than **300 mothers**, when these services were not available anywhere else.

During the conflict in Khartoum, MedGlobal delivered oxygen, fuel, and medical supplies to Al Nada Hospital via a two-hour journey across fighting parties' checkpoints and under shelling.

### Enhancing Healthcare in Sudan

More than 3 million children under five years were suffering from acute malnutrition in 2023. In response, MedGlobal provided lifesaving medical aid and support that included high-energy therapeutic biscuits, therapeutic milk treatments, clean water and full health consultations and medications.



# SUDAN CASE REPORT

## HELPING HAMED BREATHE

“Hamed, since he was born, he barely can breathe and he needs urgent medical care constantly,” said Eslam, Hamed’s mother.

Hamed, only three months old, suffers from bronchiectasis, a long-term condition where the airways of the lungs become abnormally widened.

Hamad arrived at Al Nada Hospital during the fighting in neighboring Al Thora, Omdurman. Al Nada hospital covers the absence of many health facilities in Omdurman, providing free services such as ER, ICU and INCU in addition to normal and cesarean birth.

When Hamad came to Al Nada hospital, he lacked oxygen, and without a steady supply his small body would die. He stayed in the ICU for 24 hours while positive-pressure ventilation from a Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) machine and heart monitor sounds mixed with bombing sounds as doctors worked to save him.

# COLOMBIA



## COLOMBIA UPDATE: PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

In Colombia, thousands of migrants from Venezuela, Ecuador, Haiti, Cuba, and other countries have chosen to migrate through the dangerous route of the Darien Gap in hopes of a better life.

Since December 2023, MedGlobal has provided over **200 free medical consultations, 200 prescriptions, meals, and case management services** for migrants from various nationalities transiting to Darien Gap. Our aim is to provide care before migrants enter the jungle, safeguarding the lives of our beneficiaries.

We offer food security and medical services at “Casa Venezuela” in the La Parada neighborhood, providing **3,768 medical consultations**, including diagnostic ultrasounds, and operating a soup kitchen serving **24,373 hot meals**. “Casa Venezuela” serves as the first point of contact for migrants in transit, embarking on journeys in search of a better future.

In Venezuela, MedGlobal’s mobile medical team provides services in more than **10 vulnerable neighborhoods**. And in the Tachira state, on the border of Colombia, a dedicated team of Venezuelan doctors visit the most vulnerable and impoverished areas, where healthcare services are nonexistent, and medications are only available in commercial pharmacies on the Colombian side.

# COLOMBIA CASE REPORT

## GETTING CARE TO CARRY ON

The six members of the Lameda Family have been residing in Colombia since 2022. They decided to migrate to the United States due to the impossible political and economic situation in Venezuela.

Unfortunately, while waiting for their boat in Turbo, they fell victim to robbery, losing all their money and personal belongings. Left in this vulnerable situation, they spent several days in a makeshift tent outside the port, uncertain of their next steps. Eventually, they relocated from Turbo to Medellin.

As immigrants, they had no access to healthcare, and their health conditions, primarily skin and respiratory problems, were growing critical. The MedGlobal team provided treatment and referred them to a shelter in the area, where they could shower, continue treatment, and find a safe place to sleep. MedGlobal also provided hygiene kits, formula, and supplements for the children, as well as medications for their skin and respiratory issues.

Despite the challenges they faced, the Lameda Family expressed their determination to try the journey again, as they believe there is no longer a safe place for them in Venezuela or Colombia. This is only possible because MedGlobal was able to provide the care they needed.

# YEMEN



## YEMEN UPDATE: PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

In Yemen, 18.2 million people need humanitarian aid and protection, food insecurity impacts 17.6 million individuals, and 4.5 million people have been displaced, often repeatedly over years. MedGlobal's efforts have significantly enhanced access to primary healthcare services at the Al-Fash Health Facility, situated in remote regions of the Hodeidah governorate. This comprehensive initiative encompasses child healthcare, immunizations, treatment of communicable diseases, and more.

Following Cyclone Tej, we implemented water, sanitation, and hygiene interventions aimed to mitigate vector-borne diseases, prevent outbreaks, and alleviate morbidity and mortality by providing hygiene kits and ceramic filters in Aden governorate and Al-Mahra governorate.

We have orchestrated surgical camps aimed at improving the quality of life for individuals, particularly children, affected by both congenital and acquired defects, facilitating access to more than **300 surgeries**.

We also donate and distribute vital medications and medical supplies to key hospitals across Aden, Lahj, and Al-Dalah governorates, bolstering healthcare infrastructure in these regions.

### Building a Healthy Future

Our intervention in Hodeida and Aden has had a substantial impact, bolstering comprehensive emergency obstetric and neonatal care services in two hospitals, enhancing maternal and neonatal care provision in the region. We also executed mental health and resilience training for frontline health workers to 42 trainers, who subsequently imparted their knowledge to 1,000 health workers.



# YEMEN CASE REPORT

## A CHANCE TO HEAL

“My son Suhaib has suffered from intestinal atrophy since birth,” said 18-year-old Shaima’ Abdu Hasan Bkeery. The condition causes intestines to shrink or weaken, leading to poor nutrient absorption. “A part of the intestine was removed and he would defecate through an opening in the abdomen. Due to financial hardships, we couldn’t pay for travel to visit the hospital in Mukha for wound care and treatment. My child was not feeding well, which led to severe acute malnutrition, as well as complications from the wound in his abdomen.”

When the MedGlobal mobile medical team visited, Dr. Jamil treated Suhaib’s wound, changed his dressing, and diagnosed him with severe acute malnutrition. Dr. Jamil also prescribed antibiotics, and MedGlobal’s nutritionist provided nutritional supplements and hygiene guidance.

Although the team usually visits every couple of weeks, they came every two days due to Suhaib’s severe condition. “Thanks to their efforts and God’s grace, Suhaib has recovered and is still with us,” said Shaima’ Abdu Hasan Bkeery.

# BANGLADESH



## BANGLADESH UPDATE: PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

Since October 2017, MedGlobal has been working with local and international partners in Bangladesh to provide critical primary health services for Rohingya refugees – a Muslim ethnic minority and stateless group, who were forcibly displaced en masse to Bangladesh – and vulnerable Bangladeshis. We provide a range of health services, including pediatric care, chronic disease management, family planning, reproductive healthcare, lab and point-of-care testing, and health education, at **two health posts**.

In 2023, Medglobal supported **one health post** in the Rohingya camp and a maternity center in the host community, offering free treatments and medications to men, women and children. Altogether, we've provided **22,017 free health consultations** for Rohingya and the host community, including primary care, infectious disease care, noncommunicable diseases, women's and reproductive health, pediatric care, nutrition, telemedicine, medication, postnatal and neonatal care.

MedGlobal has also offered a number of training and educational opportunities to healthcare workers and patients. **Ten MedGlobal health workers** received training on family planning, post-abortion care, noncommunicable diseases, laboratory practice, sexual and reproductive health and health resources and services availability monitoring systems. Additionally, **340 healthcare workers**, such as midwives, doctors and nurses were trained in point-of-care ultrasound, ENC Now!, ALSO and BLSO by the international trainers.

In addition, **22,468 community members** were educated on important health issues.

# BANGLADESH CASE REPORT



## ABID'S BURN RECOVERY

Abid Hossain, a two-year-old Rohingya boy, lives with his family in Leda. While playing at his relative's house, his left hand was severely burned up to the wrist by a nearby garbage fire. Despite initial treatment at a local pharmacy, his condition deteriorated. Abid's family was afraid of subsequent infections and worried because they had no money for treatment.

Abid's grandfather immediately brought him to MedGlobal's health post at Rohingya refugee camp 24. After examining the wound, MedGlobal's doctor discussed a treatment plan with his family, which reassured them Abid would be all right.

MedGlobal's nurses provided regular dressings and medications, and after two weeks of care at MedGlobal's health post, Abid's condition markedly improved, with substantial healing. After four weeks, Abid's wound healed completely.

## LIBYA UPDATE:

### PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

In September of 2023, severe floods caused by Storm Daniel ravaged Libya's eastern coast, which led to the tragic loss of 5,000 lives and left 30,000 missing. The storm's intense rainfall caused two dams to break, flooding the city of Derna and impacting its 150,000 civilians.

Many homes were washed away, and hospitals in the area were left inoperable.

MedGlobal joined forces with local stakeholders, community leaders and government bodies to provide both immediate relief and long-term support to those affected. MedGlobal's efforts in the region were focused on delivering immediate help to the community in distress.

Our comprehensive response encompasses several key initiatives.

MedGlobal delivered essential aid to **400 households** that were most severely affected by the flooding, ensuring they had access to immediate relief to stabilize their precarious situation. We also distributed enough food packages to meet the immediate nutritional needs of **2,000 individuals**, in order to alleviate the hunger that often follows such disasters.

## MOROCCO UPDATE: PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS & CRITICAL AID REPORT

In September 2023, Morocco faced the devastating aftermath of a 6.8 magnitude earthquake, resulting in significant loss of life, injuries to thousands, and extensive destruction across the region. The consequences of the earthquake have been particularly severe, exacerbating the difficulties already experienced by the region's vulnerable populations.

In response to this disaster, MedGlobal worked closely with local partners to offer prompt support to those affected. We swiftly established emergency medical care for the injured and facilitated access to essential health services. We also provided immediate relief by distributing vital supplies to support the survivors in their time of need, including food, water and blankets. Recognizing the need for urgent medical intervention, MedGlobal sponsored **35 critical surgeries** for individuals injured in the quake.

We provided **\$1.4 million in medical supplies** to support ongoing recovery efforts, ensuring a comprehensive range of equipment and medication was available to manage the health crisis effectively.

MedGlobal supported local clinics with medical equipment and supplies, enhancing their capacity to provide ongoing healthcare and to manage the increased burden post-disaster. And we dedicated resources to the advancement of mental health initiatives, delivering comprehensive training for the effective management of psychological conditions, notably post-traumatic stress disorder—an affliction frequently marginalized in the wake of natural disasters.
